## EXCERPTS OF HEDDING HISTORY BY JAMES A. ROBERTSON, HISTORIAN

A reporter for the Rochester *Courier* in 1888 wrote a piece on "How To Spend A Vacation". "The problem is solved for this section...not at mountains, seashore, etc., but at the summer school at East Epping."

During assembly week the weather, the programme, and the attendance were fine. "Think of securing for \$1.25 per person the opportunity to hear" four lectures by Rev. Selah Merrill, DD., LLD., who had spent seven years in the Holy Land, on liberal archaeology; three lectures by Miss L.J. Greeg of Derry, who used a model of the ancient tabernacle with its furniture to illustrate her talks; a lecture on Sweden by U.S. minister to Sweden, Hon. W.W. Thomas; "two lectures of intense interest by Corporal Tanner, who thrilled his audiences with army incidents, enlisting pathetic interest in his allusions to the second battle of Bull Run, in which he lost both feet, leaving him to hobble through life on artificial limbs; a lecture on the naturalist Louis Agassiz by Dr. Thomas Mill, ex president of Harvard College; a concert by Mrs. Nellie Brown Mitchell and another by Prof. W.F. Thomas and his orchestra of Cambridge, Mass."
