EXCERPTS OF HEDDING HISTORY

Our experience at Hedding and the things we learn here can have positive results for our well-being. The Peterboro *Transcript* for September 14, 1876 included the following:

A man who attended the East Epping camp-meeting, recently wrote to Lon Elliott, the [Concord Railroad's] Manchester ticket agent, the following letter:

"Dear Sir: I have been thinking I should have purchased a half-ticket for my little boy by right, the other day, from Manchester to East Epping, though the conductor pasted him without requiring it. Yet in the sight of God I do not feel quite clear in the matter. I send 40 cents, which I think is right. Yours truly, S.A.D."
